This months handy hints are all ways in which you can recycle material and encourage companies to make goods from recycled material

- Use your grey bin to recycle cans, bottles (plastic and glass), jars, cardboard paper, and clean food containers.
- 2. Use your green bin to recycle garden waste.
- 3. Use your Brown recycling bin to dispose of your vegetables and fruits if you do not have a compost heap. You can also recycle cooked food via this bin as well.
- 4. Do not bin old bread and biscuits feed it to the birds.
- 5. Use the recycling centres for large items and electrical goods etc., including

batteries.

- Buy recycled toilet paper and kitchen roll as this will help to encourage the industry to recycle more.
- 7. Buy cloth nappies these can be re-used again and again not only will you help save the planet, this will save you money in the long run.
- 8. Canned goods at the back of the food cupboard that you know you will never use cans and other goods with only a day or two left before they go out of date donate to a local food bank.
- 9. Clothes and toys can be recycled via the charity shops.
