Thank you to the OAP Hall, our BB and the Masonic Lodge for their assistance at this time. Due to the ongoing works in the church our insurance company has increased our policy. Our annual policy costs have been increased and we will now be required to pay an additional £2200.

We would like to take this opportunity to say thank you to St Margaret's Church Kirk Session and minister Maggie Hunt for allowing us the use of their sanctuary for funerals and also to hold the Harvest and Christmas Assemblies for Strathmore Primary School. Lowson Memorial Church have also kindly offered us the use of their sanctuary also.

A big thank you once again must be given to the men of the church who worked all week to empty the church of everything that was required for us to function out with the church building. It was an enormous task and ten men responded to the plea to come and help - thank you guys it really is appreciated!!!

Our thanks once again to the men of the church for the work on the shop front. The Dispatch



very kindly ran our story about our dilemma regarding the painting of the shop front and we were delight when Councilor Colin Brown stepped in to help us. What a difference it makes to the street frontage and over all appearance of East High Street. On talking of the shop we must say a huge thank you to Nicola Wilson who took up the task of managing the shop and staff when the shop opened a year past February. Nicola dedicated a huge amount of time to the shop which must have been difficult when she holds down her own job too. Nicola has decided it is time to step back and we really thank her for all her time, effort and dedication to this project but she has left the shop in a very good way and we are delighted to say that Muriel Fairley and Elma Sim have agreed to take over the running of the shop.

We wish them well and pray that people will come forward to offer them help in the shop and that as members and friends of East and Old we will continue to look out all our unwanted goods and the goods that we have too many off!!! To date after expenses over the period have been deducted our shop has brought in an amazing amount of money which is included in our DIF money.

PARKING AT THE CHURCH




There are two available car spaces beside the east door of the church for members with poor mobility.
