#### Time, Talents and Money Wish List Boards

A big thank you to all who have contributed to this new idea. We now have enough money to buy all our chairs, decorate the choir room and lots more besides. Members and friends have donated high chairs, play mats, off-set the cost of printing, banners and so much more. The time and talents board has been a bit slower but still successful with people offering to help at the Friday Fling, make tea and coffee at events, decorate the choir room, shampoo carpets and much more. The items on the boards are constantly being updated and changed so please

look at the boards every week. For those of you who are not regular attenders at the church here are a few of the items that are on the boards that you may wish to contribute to:

Pay for one quarter of the choir carpet = £150, buy an outdoor banner £30, pay for the printing of the school leaflets = £50. There were a couple of competitions and also a raffle and £500 was made which was put to the Hungarian Fund to help bring over the Hungarian choir in 2018. **The Shop** managers Muriel and Elma wanted to thank the staff for their hard work and dedication so as a thank you they held an afternoon tea in the church for the shop workers. What a great afternoon it was and once again these ladies had the tables groaning with all the goodies. What a lovely way to say thank you!

Holiday Club – this event was held from 31<sup>st</sup> July to 4<sup>th</sup> August in the church hall. A lot of organising went into the event but alas the numbers were very low. However the children that were there thoroughly enjoyed themselves and wanted us to continue into the next week. Next year we will look again at the date, maybe reverting to the first week of the school holidays and whether to run it all day as parents struggle to get their children there for half a day because of childminding issues. **Lakie Family Gathering** – on 6<sup>th</sup> August we were once again delighted to host the Lakie family gathering with members of the family travelling from different parts of Scotland, England, America and Canada. The Lakie family were in church 4 years ago and while they were in the church we baptised Jack Myles our treasurers son and on the 6<sup>th</sup> August this year while the family were with us once again we baptised Arwen Myles our treasurers second child. We would like to thank the Lakie family for the cheque for £250 that they gave us.

Relay for Life in Kirriemuir – this took place in mid-August and East and Old had two teams entered -Steeple Chasers and Steeple Chasers Too! There were 22 people between our two teams and what a great 24 hours it was! As a relatively newly ordained Elder and subsequently appointed Session Clerk, I was delighted to get the opportunity to be the Commissioner representing our Kirk Session.
