LETTER FROM THE MANSE

Hello my dear friends

Easter is just around the corner and as this edition reaches you it will be Holy Week – a time of happiness and of great sadness as our Lord Jesus Christ is betrayed and dies on the cross. It is a time of prayer and reflection during Holy Week and I ask that you consider coming to the church any day Monday to Friday $6^{th} - 10^{th}$ April and wander around our Stations of the Cross between 5:00pm and 7:00pm each of these nights. Also we hold our Maundy Thursday service and Good Friday service at 7:00pm on the 9th and 10th April. This period of prayer and reflection is quickly followed by Easter Sunday when our Lord is resurrected and the church begins with a shout of Christ is Risen! Our Easter Day in the church starts at the Lochside with a service at 8am and then our main service at 11:00am in the church. This time of year is even busier for ministers than Christmas and I like Easter in the church more than Christmas!

I am really thankful that I have God in my life and eternally grateful and thankful for what God and his Son Jesus Christ did for me, for you and for the world when Jesus died on that cross. I am also really thankful that God called me to East and Old Church in Forfar to serve as your minister – I feel truly blessed and that is down to you our members and friends of East and Old Church and the community of Forfar also. You welcomed me in with open arms even though I was from the west coast! As members of East and Old you have supported the many, many changes that have occurred in the church. You have gone out into the streets to show God's love in action, you have welcomed many, many people from other lands into your houses and this community and did so willingly. You have given of your time in so many ways that it is incalculable, the talents you have and have shared with the church and the church family is simply



immeasurable and the money you have given to the church and to the numerous charities that we have supported over these years is simply astonishing! I admire and respect you and so very appreciative and grateful for all you do to further God's mission in Forfar and further afield – thank you!

Our Outward and Forward team are always looking for new ways for East and Old's name to be out in the community and during the month of February handed out a number of thank you boxes to various agencies such as all the doctor's surgeries, all the primary schools, fire, police and ambulance and quite a few others. These thank you packs included tea, coffee, biscuit, crisps, sweets etc for their enjoyment. East and Old is very much a part of the Forfar community as are other agencies – we are all in it together. The next step we are taking is our appreciation cards which you will find enclosed within this edition. We are asking that you send this card to someone you know – it doesn't matter whether they are church members or not, friends or just acquaintances – just send it to someone you appreciate and want to say thank you to. It could be that they changed your life in some way, they were a listening ear, you liked that they smiled at you when you were feeling down – whatever the reason send the card to them to show they are appreciated. If you need more than one card let us know as we have extras.

Follow God's example, therefore, as dearly loved children and walk in the way of love, just as Christ loved us and gave himself up for us as a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God.

Just after I had forwarded this letter to our magazine editor the world as we know it changed with the restrictions of groups gathering together and the cancellation of worship services plus a raft of other rules, regulations and policies which I whole heartedly agree with. As of today changes have been made to funerals and weddings and the closure of our schools. For funerals there will be no home visits and arrangements will be made over the phone and attending the funerals will be immediate family only but a memorial service can be held later.

I know that some churches are opening their doors at certain times but I feel we need to be in isolation for a reason and I am more than happy to talk to anyone on the phone especially those who feel they are going stir crazy! I have already had a couple of phone calls from members regarding their weekly freewill offering and I am very grateful to them for thinking about this because we already run on a very tight budget and without the weekly offerings continuing to come in then we will be in real financial difficulty. Therefore can I ask that you phone your elder or myself and we will collect your envelope through your letterbox or window or phone our treasurer and ask her for a standing order form for the bank (which would suit us better). Secondly if you have been adversely hit through loss of income and are struggling let me know as I have a little money spare in the benevolent fund and unfortunately I mean a little money. I also have a little money that I can spend in Tesco if there is any food left! If you hear of any families who are really struggling for food then let me know also - they don't need to be a member to receive help.

Remember there are many worship services on the radio and I believe at this time of writing a special service each Sunday morning will be on the BBC from England. Please do not feel lonely God is with you always and I am only a phone call away.

eavenly Bites is a big hit with the primary 7 children – they really love coming along to make the food, serve it and mostly like washing up. After this is done they count the money donated by the people at the café and work out with the receipts in hand for the food whether they made a profit or loss! Needless to say they always make a profit as people give generously! The food is lovely and the service is second to none – please come along on the third Thursday of the month and join the children – you will really enjoy it. The next dates are: 23rd April, 21st May and 18th June. During Fairtrade fortnight in March the school ran a Fairtrade Café. It was open to the public and a number of our church members popped in for a cuppie and a Fairtrade goodie to eat as well as buying Fairtrade chocolate! There were certainly more of us than parents but you must remember that parents work during the day and the children were delighted we came along. Once again the service was first class and we wanted for nothing! A couple of our members could not make it along on the day so they gave our minister some money to put into the donation bowl and thank you to those who supplied baking for the day also - the staff were very grateful. As you know we collect food each week in the church which we give to the school for their Food Bank.







Please keep the donations coming in as they are needed and are greatly appreciated by the school and the parents of the pupils. Every little bit helps and thank you to a couple of our members who buy a basket load of food and to a couple of others who give Barbara Ann money to take into the school. If the school receives money they take a few pupils over to Asda and they buy the food that is required for the Foodbank. It is a teaching and learning exercise in how to budget and what are suitable foods and which are not and which food is a luxury that you cannot afford to buy when money is tight. Our Green team in the church is working alongside the schools Eco Team by promoting recycling, working in the garden at the school together and collecting in empty crisp packets for recycling and a whole lot more. In today's climate the church needs to work in partnership with other organisations and this partnership we have with Strathmore Primary school is an excellent one.

Chimes Playgroup - Our minister visits Chimes Playgroup on the last Wednesday of every month and we are not too sure who has more fun – the children or the minister. Barbara Ann usually sings a song with them, tells them a Bible story and gets the children involved in some kind of action and game. We're told that she bribes them a lot with little gifts! A few members have commented that it is lovely to see the children shout hello and wave to Barbara Ann if they see her in the street or supermarket.

A ccord has been very busy in 2020 and have performed in numerous venues for many



organisations – some of which give them a donation and others do not. The team have such fun together but want people to know it is not a closed shop! ur worship team met earlier this year and spoke of the (Dorship) Team additional worship services that were held last year and talked about this year also. There were an additional 6 new services last year from Songs of Praise, to Picnic and Praise, to Why! Why! Why! and others. There were on average 20 people at each of these services which means some had more and some had less. The worship team are trying their best to find new ways and ideas that will appeal to our members and friends to come along and hear about and worship God more and have come up with a few new ideas for this year. They like the idea of changing our service format once a month with more modern hymns and music. They also like the idea of another Songs of Praise and a service based around themes like films or food. Our minister is very grateful to the members of the worship team for covering for her holidays and filling in at all the worship services including care home services.

Church Family Trips – since last summer the church has run a family community trip to Edinburgh Zoo, Glasgow Science Centre, and Dynamic Earth and on the 6th April we are off to Active Kids near Perth. These trips have been funded by Angus Presbytery Ministry and



Mission Rebate alongside Angus Council who gave us money for the packed lunches. The trips are to help families spend time together and a low cost day away especially when you have 2 adults and 3 or 4 children.

The funding we received also helped to pay for the Christmas Party in December last year. A big thank you to Paula Stewart for organising these events and being there on the day and also picking up all the packed lunches for between 70-80 people on each trip!

B ig Breakfast – our BB Company held their Big Breakfast in the church at the end of February and what a feast it was. Fruit juice, fresh fruit, cereal, bacon, sausages, rolls plus as much tea and coffee as you wanted. It was a huge success with over £296 was raised and those present were served by well-mannered young men with a bright smile on their faces. Thank you to the leaders and boys and other helpers.

It has been announced by the UK/Scottish Government that as of 16 March anyone developing symptoms consistent with COVID-19, however mild, should stay at home for 7 days from the onset of symptoms as per existing advice. In addition, it is now recommended that anyone living in the same household as a symptomatic person should self-isolate for 14 days after the first household member first gets symptoms.

The most common symptoms of COVID-19 are recent onset of:

- new continuous cough and/or
- high temperature

Information for the public on COVID-19, including stay at home advice for people who are self-isolating, can be found on <u>NHS Inform</u> website.

Further, people are advised to take social distancing measures to help reduce the transmission of COVID-19. In particular, this is strongly advised for people aged 70 or over, people with underlying medical conditions and pregnant women.

If you have to self-isolate, you could ask a friend, family member or delivery service to collect your repeat prescription, buy groceries or run errands on your behalf.



Renovations Update

Our Phase 2 renovations are quietly – or not so quietly on occasion – progressing largely unseen. The vestry office and toilet are now completed on the ground floor. Electrical works are ongoing in the upper rooms. The lift shaft is completed, and the lift installation is progressing well with commissioning to happen very soon. Once the lift is operational, we will have much better access to the upper level should anyone like to see the spaces we are working on there. An extension to the ventilation system has been commissioned and this work will begin shortly.

The property team have again been heavily involved and saved literally thousands of pounds in labour costs to date. Unfortunately, not all elements of the work can be undertaken in-house and we have some significant costs committed to for the works under way, with external contractors.

- The electrical works £21,598
- The lift £20,058 balance to pay we have already paid a significant deposit
- Ventilation £8,900
- Plumbing works and new water supply estimate £10,000
- Roof repairs (leaking above new reception) £9,000
- Total commitments to spend £69,556

The remaining works after this stage will include – significant joinery works to build stud walls and partitions; creation of two meeting rooms with a moveable divider; a toilet block and fittings in the Session house; specialist flooring in the large activity space above the Social Space; multiple false ceilings in the upper level and the link corridor by the vestry; fitting of many doors and lastly – decoration throughout. While it sounds a lot of work it is literally the 'last lap' and we are aiming to complete the works before the end of December 2020. You, the congregation, members and friends of East & Old Parish Church have generously funded most of these works and the future benefit to our Church and Local community will be a legacy and tribute to this support. We have also been supported by local businesses and grants along our journey for which we are also tremendously grateful.
