



WHAT'S BEEN HAPPENING

Our church building re-opened on Palm Sunday with a capacity of 50 people at each service and it was so good to welcome everyone back. All the usual protocols were in place and everything went without a hitch! Barbara Ann would like to say thank you to Isabel Farquharson and Bob Kidd for taking the services on Maundy Thursday and Good Friday when she had a really bad throat and couldn't speak very well. Easter Sunday was particularly busy and we would like to thank the elders who went home so other members could stay. You missed out on your Crème Egg but we will make it up to you.

As of Sunday 2nd May our capacity has increased in line with government guidance so that we can now take 75 people downstairs and 16 up in the gallery. By the time this issue is printed that may have changed again but only if they relax the 2-metre rule to 1-metre or no social distancing.

We are now allowed to start various activities within the church, however for some of the activities like coffee mornings and Cosy Corner where social distancing is a problem, while other activities

cannot re-start because the rules of adults meeting indoors has not changed yet. At the time of writing this Weddings and Funerals were at 50 people however there are very few venues in Forfar that can take 50 people socially distant for a funeral tea. We will try our best to keep you up to date.

Kirk Session Meetings

The final full size Kirk Session meeting took place at the end of March where many things were discussed, and our annual accounts approved before voting on the members of the new Kirk Session which would come into effect at the Stated Annual Meeting in April. Our minister Barbara Ann, Session Clerk Lexi Smart and Depute Session Clerk Karen Kelly are automatically on the new Kirk Session because of the roles and positions they hold within the church. The conveners of the Strategy Group, Mission Group, Green Group and Media group also have automatic places however they can ask someone else in their group to represent the group not necessarily the convener. To that end our members are Angus Spence – Strategy Group, Jim Stewart – Mission, Heather Munro – Green and Bob Kidd – Media. As Heather is not an ordained elder she is on as a convener and a member of the congregation with the other congregational member being Marion Duncan. That left us with four spaces to fill and eight names to vote on. The additional four members were Alf Birse, Jean Alexander, Karen Liddle and Isabel Farquharson. Thank you to everyone who put their name forward. Remember if anyone would like a copy of our accounts or a copy of the Kirk Session minutes just let Lexi or Karen Kelly know.

The new Kirk Session met for the first time on Monday 19th April on Zoom with full attendance where a new strategy was discussed and re-arranging which elders were to serve on which committees, but the

big change is that we are looking for members of the congregation to join our groups for a designated period or for a special project. It may only be for one month, six months or even a year but not for life. At the end of the meeting, it was discussed as to how long each person would serve on the Kirk Session. Normally it would three years however we do not want everyone coming off the Kirk Session at the same time, so we needed to stagger who came off when. To that end: one year – Bob Kidd; two years – Alf Birse, Heather Munro and Karen Liddle; three years – Marion Duncan, Jean Alexander and Isabel Farquharson; four years – Angus Spence and Jim Stewart. When we are looking for new members it will be announced and voting will take place at the Stated Annual Meeting each year.

Stated Annual Meeting (SAM) - Our SAM took place via Zoom on 12th April and although it was not very busy, there were in excess of 20 people. It was agreed by the Kirk Session to amend the basis of union of 1978 to which congregational approval was also required. After being intimated in the last edition of the Steeple Times and subsequently voted on at the SAM, the basis of union was changed accordingly. Barbara Ann received a special thanks at the SAM for all her work, guidance, support and vision and was delighted to receive a bouquet of flowers the following morning.

As you are aware Barbara Ann is the chair of the local Leprosy Mission committee and our representative on that committee is Esther Kidd. A Zoom meeting was held with the CEO and support worker of Leprosy Mission Scotland and with the Forfar Leprosy Mission team. They were given updates, happy and joyous stories and stories of concern. Since nothing has happened for over eighteen months, we think you should watch this space!

Dübendorf Church linked with Schwerzenbach Church near Zurich - Barbara Ann held a meeting on Zoom with Rev Catherine McMillan for Switzerland to catch up and see what else we can do together with them. They are booked to come to Oberammergau to meet up with some us next July which will be great. Barbara Ann and Catherine would like to hold a Zoom reunion night for those people who went to Switzerland and for those who hosted the Swiss when they came here. **A provisional date for this meeting has been set for Wednesday 30th June.**





This is a new digital service to support venues and businesses with collecting contact details for contact tracing purposes due to the Covid-19 pandemic. Check-In Scotland will allow you to log your contact details with any business or venue displaying the Check-In Scotland Test and Protect QR code poster.

Using this service to record your contact details on entering the church is entirely optional so don't worry if you do not have a mobile phone or are unable to use it - we will record your details manually just as we have been doing recently.

How to use the Check in Scotland app


To use the app, simply download it to your mobile phone (from either the Apple App Store or from Google Play) open the App and then scan the **Check In Scotland QR code** using your phone. Checking in will give the NHS the time and date you arrived. Any contact details collected will be held in a secure, encrypted data store unique to each venue for 21 days.

Alerts will be sent by SMS, email or letter depending on what details users provide and will be clearly marked as being from NHS Scotland Test and Protect.

Who can use the Check in Scotland app?

Anyone over the age of 12 can use the Check In Scotland service. The service is designed to take as few details from you as needed.


- Once the App has been installed on your mobile phone you will be asked to add your First name, Last name, Phone number, Email address and Home address (*save your details when prompted so that the app stores them for future use*)




- On entering the church, open the **Check In Scotland App** and select **Scan QR code**



- When leaving the church remember to select the **Check out** option in the App on your mobile phone



- Point your camera at the QR code on the poster to scan it



The Twinning Committee met again online with our counterparts in Zuglo Church, Hungary at the end of April. It was good to have some more members from our side join us after the call in the last Steeple Times for anyone who is interested. The first thing we did was organise our next meeting, which will take the format of a joint bible study with the Scots and Hungarians, conducted by our minister, Barbara Ann. We would like to invite all members of East & Old to join us for this, you don't have to be involved in the twinning committee to come to this and you don't need to "do" anything! If you are interested in joining our bible study session on Monday 7th June at 7:00pm, please just let Barbara Ann or Karen Liddle know and we'll send you the Zoom link for the meeting.

The next part of our meeting was very interesting indeed. Barbara Ann led a discussion on bioethics – looking at the “big

questions” and how our opinions are shaped by our faith, or not. The tough moral questions we looked at were euthanasia, stem cell transplants and abortion. It really made us think about our own beliefs and why we think what we do, and it was fascinating to hear the Zuglo Church members' views on the topics. We look forward to our next meeting with all our Hungarian friends and an enjoyable time together.
